# Harvey Daniels, Ph.D.

**Professor of Secondary Education,  
National-Louis University**

Dr. Harvey Daniels began teaching high school on the west side of Chicago in 1969. Since that time, he has been a city and suburban classroom teacher, writing project director, author, and university professor. Also known as “Smokey,” Dr. Daniels received all of his degrees—B.A., M.A., and Ph.D.—from Northwestern University. He now serves as an international consultant to schools, districts, and educational agencies. In these efforts, Dr. Daniels regularly teaches demonstration lessons in classrooms, leads seminars and workshops for teachers, and collaborates with school leaders on long-term change efforts.

Dr. Daniels is well-known for his pioneering work on student-led book clubs, as recounted in *Literature Circles: Voice and Choice in Book Clubs and Reading Groups* (2002) and his newer title, *Minilessons for Literature Circles* (2004). He has authored or co-authored eleven other books on language, literacy, and education. His most recent work involves nonfiction comprehension and composition and is outlined in *Subjects Matter: Every Teacher’s Guide to Content-Area Reading* (2004) and *Content Area Writing: Every Teacher’s Guide* (2007). Both books help students to better understand, remember, and apply what they read in English classes and across the curriculum. Dr. Daniels is on the faculty of National-Louis University in Chicago and is Founding Director of the Walloon Institute.
